**JUSTIFICATION AND APPROVAL FOR
USE OF OTHER THAN FULL AND OPEN COMPETITION**

1. Contracting Activity. Marine Corps Logistics Command Contracting Office, Albany, GA

2. Description of Action Being Approved.

The surge in combat and support equipment assets being returned from the deployed Marine Forces to Remote Storage Activities has resulted in a significant increase in required labor resources to execute DMC's core processes of receipt, storage, and distribution. Contract support is required to provide management, supervision, personnel, materials handling equipment, personnel transport vehicles, and services necessary to provide support to the overall effort ensuring sustained and uninterrupted operations. Contracted general labor services are required for Integrated Logistics Support related to inventory management and control, general warehousing, storage, tactical vehicle maintenance, equipment marking and labeling, and distribution of Marine Corps PEIs. The contractor employees will be employed in various shops/locations within PPB control to perform welding, fabrication and other ground combat vehicle maintenance to include Mechanical, Hydraulic, Electrical, Electronics, Engineering, Optical, Cleaning, Media/Sand Blasting, Painting, and Support functions. Base support shall be provided as required by the contract. This maintenance will be performed at Production Plant Barstow, (PPB) and Corrosion Repair Facility (CRF) Camp Pendleton, Ca. Types of ground combat equipment to be repaired, rebuilt, or overhauled includes both wheeled and tracked vehicles such as but not limited to Amphibious Assault Vehicles, Light Armored Vehicles, Trucks, Cranes, Generators, and Components (Mechanical, Hydraulic, Electrical and Electronics).

3. Description of Supplies/Services.

Tasks to be performed by the contractor in support of the Marine Depot Maintenance Command (MDMC), Production Plant Barstow, Barstow, Ca. The contractor shall provide maintenance support, including removal replacement, repair, rebuild, fabrication of components and vehicle armor kits needed by the various shops during the vehicle maintenance cycle to maintain Maintenance Center Barstow (MCB) CA's production schedules

4. Statutory Authority Permitting Other Than Full and Open Competition.

The statutory authority permitting other than full and open competition is 10 USC 2304(c)(2), as implemented by the Federal Acquisition Regulation (FAR) 6.302-2, Unusual and compelling urgency.

5. Rationale Justifying Use of Cited Statutory Authority.

The statutory authority cited is FAR 6.302-2, unusual and compelling urgency is necessary as delay in award of this contract would result in serious injury, financial or other, to the government as this is for the preparation and storage of equipment, and vehicles being returned from different areas of operations. If the contract modification is not

approved Production Plant Barstow will be at a work stoppage creating an extensive backlog having a delay of return of PEIs and equipment awaiting issuance to the Operating Forces.

6. Description of Efforts Made to Solicit Offers from as Many Offerors as Possible
