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Energy Conservation Investment Program (ECIP) P-404 Reuse Water (Purple Pipe) Camp Lemonnier, Djibouti, Africa. Install a duplex water pump station in a pre-engineered metal building, and approximately 2,700 linear meters of reuse water piping and all appurtenances. The purple pipe system will distribute reuse water from the existing reuse water tank to ablution units (toilets and urinals only) located in the Camp's berthing area (CLUville blocks B through E, plus Tango 5 berthing), plus the capacity to supply three (3) future BEQs. Additional work includes a pre-engineered metal building to enclose the reuse water pump station designed by a registered structural engineer consisting of a corrosion-resistant, extruded aluminum structure; the maximum dimensions shall not exceed 37 square meters. The structure is to be supported on a concrete slab and perimeter foundation. The objective of this project is to conserve energy resources by using the Camp's reuse water in order to comply with the Energy Policy Act of 2005, executive Order 13423 and the Energy Independence and Security Act (EISA) of 2007. Currently, the Camp has treated and storage facilities for reuse water from the Waste Water Treatment Plant. Project completion date is anticipated to be 300 calendar days from date of contract award.

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Procurement Method: Contracting by Negotiation, Full and Open Competition

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Estimated cost: \$1,000,000 to \$5,000,000

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This is a new procurement. It does not replace an existing contract. No prior contract information exists.
