JUSTIFICATION AND APPROVAL
 FOR USE OF LIMITED SOURCE

1. Contracting Activity.

Naval Supply Systems Command, Fleet Logistics Center Yokosuka, Site Singapore.

2. Description of the Action Being Approved.

FLCY Site Singapore requests approval to pursue the award of a limited source contract for husbanding services in support of numerous Navy vessels that will be stationed in the Philippines to provide Humanitarian Assistance and Disaster Relief (HADR) support due to Typhoon Haiyan. Once awarded, the contract will also be available for use during its performance period in support of other Navy vessels that may be directed to ports included in the contract for reasons not directly associated with HADR support.

3. Description of Supplies/Services.

The multiple Navy vessels require a contract for Husbanding Services while stationed at multiple ports in the Philippines with a period of performance of base period of two months and a two months option period. The Husbanding Services contract covers a variety of differing needs; such as trash removal, brow services, ship movement services, general charter and hire services, collection holding and transfer (CHT) services, potable water, utility services, land transportation services, communications services and force protection services. These services are essential to the Navy vessels to be able to perform normal operations. The current independent government estimate (IGE) is \$66,020,055.36 for the base period of 2 months and the option period of two months. FLCY Site Singapore is requesting \$5,000.00 in FY14, Operations and Maintenance Navy (O&MN) Funds to act as the minimum guarantee for this proposed contract.

4. Statutory Authority Permitting Limited Source.

In accordance with 10 U.S.C 2304(c)(2), cited in FAR 6.302-2(a)(1), When the agency's need for the supplies or services is of such an unusual and compelling urgency that the Government would be seriously injured unless the agency is permitted to limit the number of sources from which it solicits bids or proposals, full and open competition need not be provided for.

5. Rationale Justifying Use of Cited Statutory Authority.

Typhoon Haiyan struck land in the Philippines on 8 November 2013; it was the strongest storm to hit the Southeastern Asia region in recent years. Due to the mass destruction the Commander US 7th Fleet is assisting with the Humanitarian efforts and has already tasked multiple ships with changing course immediately to assist the Philippines. Given the short time frame FLC Site Singapore has to award a new Husbanding contract immediately in order for the ships to have service upon their arrival. There is insufficient time to do full and open competition, which would take many months. Therefore, the competition will be limited as set forth in paragraph 6 below.

6. Description of Efforts Made to Solicit Offers from as Many Offerors as Practicable.

Based on previous solicitations for the Philippines, only 3 offerors have the ability to quickly gather enough resources to be able to successfully provide Husbanding services at multiple ports in the Philippines. These offerors are Global Maritime Logistic Support, Inc (Global), Multinational Logistic Services Limited (MLS) and Inchape Shipping Services (ISS). All three of these offerors have the ability to meet the deadline and provide the resources within the requested timeframe. All three offerors have a record of acceptable previous government past performance.

A request for proposal (RFP) will be made available to all three offerors. All offerors were determined to have acceptable Antiterrorism/Force Protection (AT/FP) Plans in accordance with the technical capability specified in previous solicitations. Other prospective offerors will not be considered for award because of the limited time available to evaluate offers.

7. Determination of Fair and Reasonable Cost. The Contracting Officer anticipates receiving competition from all three offerors. The proposals received will aid in determining the award price to be fair and reasonable. If only one offer is received there is sufficient historical information to assist in evaluating price to determine if it is fair and reasonable.

8. Actions to Remove Barriers to Future Competition.

The limitation on full and open competition is not due to lack of advance planning since the vessels are only making port in the Philippines to assist with humanitarian efforts due to a natural disaster. If this requirement wasn't considered urgent and compelling full and open competition could be utilized as long as a sufficient time frame exists from the requirement being recognized and the period of performance.






