<p>In response to previous question (1.b.), which stated: "Usually in working on new projects as referenced of \$20M or more, we have both a project manager (who could be an Architect or Engineer) AND a project architect—if we provide both, would both roles be scored?", contracting replied: "No, submit Specialized Experience for only the 2 Project Architects." Please confirm that there is no need for a designated PM on the org chart, given that the solicitation says PM OR Project Architects, and we are highlighting our Project Architects as well as the Principal in Charge as Key Personnel?</p>	<p>Confirmed in the case of the scenario described. Please be advised, however, that there could be another scenario, where a team consists of a Project Manager, who will also function as the Project Architect; hence, the identification of "Project Manager or Project Architect" as key personnel. In this case, the Project Manager should be identified on the org chart; and the Project Manager's specialized architectural design experience, in his/her role as Project Architect, should be depicted for Criterion 2.</p>
<p>If we recently obtained a PPQ for a relevant project in F, would we be able to use this, even if it was originally for another solicitation?</p>	<p>Yes, as long as the PPQ meets the requirements for Criterion 1 and 3.</p>
<p>Pursuant to Criterion 9, Volume of Work, please confirm that JVs should provide the list of all DoD contracts/task orders awarded only to that JV in the last 12 months.</p>	<p>Yes, for the JV's on the JV agreement on this solicitation.</p>
