STATEMENT OF WORK

STATEMENT OF WORK
For
INSPECTION, SERVICING, and REPAIR/REFURBISH
of
LCC MEDIUM VOLTAGE EQUIPMENT

1. BACKGROUND

The Large Cavitation Channel (LCC) is a US Navy test facility used to conduct advanced ship and research testing. The power for LCC operations is provided through the LCC Substation (Sub 7). Two known equipment failures must be repaired/refurbished to ensure proper and safe operations of the substation equipment. In addition, all equipment in the substation needs to be inspected and serviced to ensure proper and safe operations and to identify any deficiencies that require future repairs/refurbishment.

2. GENERAL

The contractor shall provide all properly trained and qualified personnel: equipment; parts; accessories; supplies; tools; materials and project supervision, necessary to perform the items and services in accordance with the Statement of Work within the scope of the LCC Substation.

For the purposes of this Statement of work Medium Voltage is defined as voltages between 1 kV and 35 kV.

2.1. DESCRIPTION OF SYSTEM

The LCC Substation consists of the following equipment:

- 2.1.1. 24 kV Medium Voltage Distribution Breaker
- 2.1.2. 24 kV substation structural, buswork, and grounding
- 2.1.3. Operated Air Break Switches
- 2.1.4. Transformers, including associated equipment
- 2.1.5. Power Fuses, Arrestors, and Insulators

2.2. CONTRACTOR QUALIFICATIONS

The Contractor performing this work must provide:

- 2.2.1. Trained and qualified personnel to work on 24 kV voltage distribution equipment.

- 2.2.2. Experience as regularly engaged in inspecting and repairing medium voltage distribution equipment.
- 2.2.3. ABB factory trained technicians.

2.3. REQUIREMENTS

2.3.1. GENERAL

- 2.3.1.1. All work must be performed in compliance with the National Electrical Code, OSHA standards, and all applicable local codes and regulations.
- 2.3.1.2. All replacement parts shall be new and all work performed in accordance with the original manufacturer's requirements and specifications.
- 2.3.1.3. Work being performed is in a US government facility. Only US Citizens or persons with a valid Green Card will be admitted. All personnel entering site must complete proper documentation at least one (1) month prior to accessing the site, and be screened prior to site access. Necessary information will include, but not be limited too; Name, Social Security Number, Date of Birth, Place of Birth, Driver's License Number, Current Address, and Citizenship.
- 2.3.1.4. Work hours will be limited to between 0800 and 1530, Monday through Friday (except Federal holidays).

2.4. REQUIREMENTS

2.4.1. GENERAL (applicable for base and options)

- 2.4.1.1. Electrically isolate and perform all safety requirements to prevent potential exposure to live voltages, including utilization of grounding devices. Perform all work in accordance with OSHA and Electrical Safety Standards. Coordinate and obtain approval from the LCC Operations Manager prior performing any operation with exposed voltages.
- 2.4.1.2. Coordinate and obtain approval from the LCC Operations Manager prior to deenergizing any circuits. Total substation power outages are to be minimized and for short durations. Under no circumstances is the entire substation be left unpowered at the end of the day.

- 2.4.1.3. If necessary, with approval of the LCC Operations Manager, the primary power to the Medium Voltage Distribution Circuit Breaker can be mechanically disconnected for a period of time, including overnight, to perform work. Once disconnected, the incoming power can be restored to the facility circuits while the LCC test portion of the substation remains unpowered to support the performance of work.
- 2.4.1.4. Throughout this document, references to specific substation equipment refers to all components of that equipment such as cabinet, roof, bushings, bushing current transformers, current interrupters, pressure switches, linkages, operating mechanism, auxiliary switches, indicators, heaters, terminal blocks, panels, legs, ground fault relays, overcurrent relays, control and instrument switches, lamps, lock-out relays, wiring and auxiliary controls.
- 2.4.1.5. For all transformers listed in section 2.4, perform the following electrical tests:
 - a. Polarization Index test
 - b. Insulation value test (DC Megger)

2.4.2. Medium Voltage Distribution Circuit Breaker (Circuit Breaker)

- 2.4.2.1. Conduct a detailed inspection of the circuit breaker and develop a listing of all components requiring replacement to return the Circuit Breaker to manufacturer's original specification.
- 2.4.2.2. Obtain and install new OEM replacement actuator rod bolt or certify that the current actuator rod bolt meets the OEM specifications (a mechanical failure of an original rod bolt occurred in 2012 and a replacement was manufactured and installed to restore operation for urgent testing).
- 2.4.2.3. Inspect and test installed current interrupters. Provide a report on their condition (insulation, SF6 pressure, etc.) documenting their condition and identifying any failures.
- 2.4.2.4. After testing, recommend to LCC representative one of the following based on the condition of the current interrupters:
 - a. Reinstall existing current interrupters "as is," if within specifications.
 - b. Install refurbished current interrupters through Option 1.
 - c. Install new current interrupters through Option 2.

- 2.4.2.5. Inspect all control wiring between the Medium Voltage Cabinet and the Control Cabinet. Inspect all terminal connectors. Insure all fasteners are properly torqued per manufacturer's specification. Provide a listing of wiring/connectors requiring repair or replacement.
- 2.4.2.6. Inspect all medium voltage conductors (braided straps, fasteners, etc). Provide a listing of medium voltage conductors requiring repair or replacement.
- 2.4.2.7. Clean and inspect all linkages. Lubricate, adjust, and/or replace components as required to meet original manufacturer's specifications.
- 2.4.2.8. Inspect and verify operation of current transformers, ammeter and associated switch, capacitor trips, strip heaters, trip relay and bridge rectifier. Document all measurements/test results.
- 2.4.2.9. Clean and inspect all power bushings and insulators. Provide a listing of components requiring repair or replacement.
- 2.4.2.10. Verify proper installation and operation and perform maintenance requirements per manufacturer's instructions per the 24 kV Circuit Breaker Operating and Maintenance Manual CBI Submittal 16486-00, including calibration, of the following. Document all measurements/test results.
 - a) Ground Fault Relay and Ground Sensor System
 - b) Overcurrent Relay
 - c) Control and Instrumentation Switches
 - d) Indicating Lamps
 - e) Lock-Out Relay
 - f) Ammeter and associated switch
 - g) Capacitor Trips
 - h) Strip Heaters
 - i) Trip Relay
- 2.4.2.11. Inspect and test the Circuit Breaker cabinet ground insuring that sufficient grounding to earth is provided to meet the manufacture's specifications.
- 2.4.2.12. Once the Circuit Breaker has been reassembled, verify installation of all components per the Installation Section of ABB 15 GKD & 26 GKD Medium Voltage Outdoor Distribution Circuit Breaker Installation/Maintenance Instructions (IB6.2.1.7-1-A). Document any deviations and provide to the LCC Representative.

- 2.4.2.13. Prior to reconnecting primary power, perform all Testing and Final Inspection requirements per ABB 15 GKD & 26 GKD Medium Voltage Outdoor Distribution Circuit Breaker Installation/Maintenance Instructions (IB6.2.1.7-1-A). Document requirements performed and any test results/measurements. Provide document to LCC Representative.
- 2.4.2.14. At a minimum, all medium voltage conductors and insulators must be tested for leakage to ground and phase to phase. Provide a written copy of the measurements to the Government
- 2.4.2.15. Upon complete reassembly, repair, and testing of the Circuit Breaker (including covers), coordinate and obtain approval to deenergize Substation 7 and reconnect the Circuit Breaker, if required and/or reenergize the entire Substation 7.
- 2.4.2.16. Once all work is completed and power is restored, coordinate and support final checkout of remote operations through the LCC Control System.

2.4.3. Cutler-Hammer 15 kV Disconnect Switch

- 2.4.3.1. In conjunction with the 2.4.2, repair disconnect switch indicator to insure proper switch status indication (currently will indicate “Open” when switch is still closed).
- 2.4.3.2. Inspect cabinet alignment, level, and plumb. Adjust and shim as required to obtain proper alignment and square, including adjustments of transformer. Once properly aligned and adjusted, fasten transformer and switch cabinet to concrete pad to prevent movement.
- 2.4.3.3. Service and perform all maintenance steps for switch and associated equipment in accordance with manufacturer’s instructions, with the exception of “High Potential Tests” that are not desired. Make required adjustments as needed.
- 2.4.3.4. Check for loose or corroded electrical connections. Where necessary, tighten or clean electrical connections.

2.4.4. Niagara 6,350 kVA Power Transformers

- 2.4.4.1. Inspect and test three (3) Niagara 6,350 kVA power transformers including associated hardware.

- 2.4.4.2. Inspect transformers and provide a report on physical condition, liquid level and temperature. Inspect for rust and corrosion. Inspect for loose mountings and connections; noisy operations; signs of arcing; excessive heat; etc. Check for loose or corroded electrical connections, and tighten or clean where necessary. Check foundations and supporting pads for movement, damage, rot, and insect infestation. Check grills and louvers for proper ventilation. Check case for interior moisture, active desiccant, weather tightness, and vents. Check for oil leaks. Take oil samples and have analyzed for dielectric, physical, and chemical properties per ASTM methods.
- 2.4.4.3. Inspect, clean, adjust, and/or test, as necessary; bushings, liquid temperature indicators, liquid level gauges, pressure vacuum gauge, pressure relief devices, rapid pressure rise relay, winding temperature indicator, and insulators.
- 2.4.4.4. Provide a report of all findings, adjustments made, and recommendations for needed repairs, maintenance, or adjustments.

2.4.5. Ward 2,500 kVA Power Transformers

- 2.4.5.1. Inspect and test one (1) Ward 2,500 kVA power transformer including associated hardware.
- 2.4.5.2. Inspect transformers and provide a report on physical condition, liquid level and temperature. Inspect for rust and corrosion. Remove rust and corrosion and apply paint where applicable. Inspect for loose mountings and connections; noisy operations; signs of arcing; excessive heat; etc. Check for loose or corroded electrical connections, and tighten or clean where necessary. Check foundations and supporting pads for movement, damage, rot, and insect infestation. Check grills and louvers for proper ventilation. Check case for interior moisture, active desiccant, weather tightness, and vents. Check for oil leaks. Take oil samples and have analyzed for dielectric, physical, and chemical properties per ASTM methods.
- 2.4.5.3. Inspect, clean, adjust, and/or test, as necessary; bushings, liquid temperature indicators, liquid level gauges, pressure vacuum gauge, pressure relief devices, rapid pressure rise relay, winding temperature indicator, and insulators.
- 2.4.5.4. Provide a report of all findings, adjustments made, and recommendations for needed repairs, maintenance, or adjustments.

2.4.6. Niagara 1,500 kVA Power Transformers

- 2.4.6.1. Inspect and test two (2) Niagara 1,500 kVA power transformers including associated hardware and Interrupter Switch.
- 2.4.6.2. Inspect transformers and provide a report on physical condition, liquid level and temperature. Inspect for rust and corrosion. Inspect for loose mountings and connections; noisy operations; signs of arcing; excessive heat; etc. Check for loose or corroded electrical connections, and tighten or clean where necessary. Check foundations and supporting pads for movement, damage, rot, and insect infestation. Check grills and louvers for proper ventilation. Check case for interior moisture, active desiccant, weather tightness, and vents. Check for oil leaks. Take oil samples and have analyzed for dielectric, physical, and chemical properties per ASTM methods.
- 2.4.6.3. Inspect and perform maintenance on transformer disconnect switches. Perform all maintenance steps in accordance with manufacturer's instructions (Powercon Corp, Type PIF Frame Mounted, Load Break Interrupter Switch 35 kV 600A Instruction Book PCIB 1003) with the exception of "High Potential Tests" that are not desired. Make required adjustments as needed.
- 2.4.6.4. Inspect, clean, adjust, and/or test, as necessary; bushings, liquid temperature indicators, liquid level gauges, pressure vacuum gauge, pressure relief devices, rapid pressure rise relay, winding temperature indicator, and insulators.
- 2.4.6.5. Provide a report of all findings, adjustments made, and recommendations for needed repairs, maintenance, or adjustments.

2.4.7. Other Substation Equipment

- 2.4.7.1. Operated Air Break Switches: Inspect, operate, adjust, and/or clean Substation 7 air-break switches. Provide a report of all findings, adjustments made, and recommendations for needed repairs.
- 2.4.7.2. 24 kV Substation Structural: Conduct a visual inspection of the structural components and provide results.
- 2.4.7.3. 24 kV Substation Buswork: Conduct a visual inspection of the buswork and provide results.
- 2.4.7.4. 24 kV Substation Buswork: Conduct a DC megger test of the buswork and provide results.
- 2.4.7.5. 24 kV Substation Grounding: Conduct a visual inspection, and electrical check of the substation grounding system.
- 2.4.7.6. Power Fuses, Arrestors, and Insulators: Inspect and clean, as needed, substation power fuses, arrestors, and insulators. Provide results of findings.

- 2.4.7.7. Capacitor Bank: Conduct a visual inspection of the substation capacitor banks and provide results of observations.

2.4.8. OPTION 1: Refurbish/Recharge Circuit Breaker Current Interrupter

- 2.4.8.1. If option is awarded, refurbish to manufacturer's original specifications three (3) complete Current Interrupter assemblies for ABB Medium Voltage Distribution Breaker, including recharging gas bottle with SF6 gas. Assemblies include associated pressure sensors, gas filling valves, and filters.

2.4.9. OPTION 2: Provide New Circuit Breaker Current Interrupter

- 2.4.9.1. If option is awarded, provide three (3) new complete Current Interrupter assemblies for ABB Medium Voltage Distribution Breaker. Assemblies include associated pressure sensors, gas filling valves, and filters.

2.4.10. OPTION 3: Install 1200 A 24 kV Power Fuse

- 2.4.10.1. If option is awarded, procure and install properly sized for the application of breaking the load and electrically isolating the ABB Medium Voltage Distribution Breaker from the incoming power, thereby isolating the LCC test portion of Substation 7. Once installed, these power fuses will be used to electrically isolate the Circuit Breaker without having to mechanically disconnect the primary side conductors.

2.4.11. OPTION 4: Install Capacitor Bank Lightning Protection

- 2.4.11.1. If option is awarded, procure necessary material and install lightning protection for LCC capacitor banks.

252.232-7006 WIDE AREA WORKFLOW PAYMENT INSTRUCTIONS (JUN 2012)

(a) Definitions. As used in this clause--

Department of Defense Activity Address Code (DoDAAC) is a six position code that uniquely identifies a unit, activity, or organization.

Document type means the type of payment request or receiving report available for creation in Wide Area WorkFlow (WAWF).

Local processing office (LPO) is the office responsible for payment certification when payment certification is done external to the entitlement system.

(b) Electronic invoicing. The WAWF system is the method to electronically process vendor payment requests and receiving reports, as authorized by DFARS 252.232-7003, Electronic Submission of Payment Requests and Receiving Reports.

(c) WAWF access. To access WAWF, the Contractor shall--

(1) Have a designated electronic business point of contact in the Central Contractor Registration at <https://www.acquisition.gov>; and

(2) Be registered to use WAWF at <https://wawf.eb.mil/> following the step-by-step procedures for self-registration available at this Web site.

(d) WAWF training. The Contractor should follow the training instructions of the WAWF Web-Based Training Course and use the Practice Training Site before submitting payment requests through WAWF. (f) WAWF payment instructions. The Contractor must use the following information when submitting payment requests and receiving reports in WAWF for this contract/order:

(1) Document type. The Contractor shall use the following document type(s).
