Section C - Descriptions and Specifications

STATEMENT OF WORK

PERIOD OF PERFORMANCE: One year from date of award.

PLACE OF PERFORMANCE: The services required by this procurement shall be performed at the CNO Strategic Studies Group, Newport, RI, other Navy, DoD or commercial sites, and at the contractor's facility.

BACKGROUND: The mission of the Chief of Naval Operations (CNO) Strategic Studies Group (SSG) is to develop revolutionary naval warfare concepts for the timeframe of 2030 and beyond. The Analytic Potentials of Nonverbal Communication Behavior (APNVCB) project principal investigator (PI) is continuing development of an approach to decoding movement patterns and supporting human decision-making and leadership style as part of the SSG work. The objective of the ongoing work is to further advance and test behavioral movement analysis as an analytic tool to predict human decision-making style by applying existing results to current and former world leaders. The applicability of this research to military team dynamics will also be evaluated.

Using the results of the pilot study completed in 2011 and additional analysis of selected leaders, the objective of this work is to further develop the tools and methods of movement analysis through the use of state-of-the-art neurological research methods. These findings will be used to set up future research to test the approach on a much larger research sample thereby validating earlier project hypotheses in regard to real-world subjects. The current phase of research continues to examine how movement analysis, and one model in particular, Movement Pattern Analysis (MPA) may indicate predictive associations to behavioral decision making and leadership style assessment.

The next step in the overall MPA research is to use Resting-State, Functional Connectivity Magnetic Resonance Imaging (rs-fcMRI) to examine the hypothesis that there is a definable neurobiology that underlies decision making style and MPA, and that the strength of brain connectivity of two different prefrontal brain systems can successfully differentiate between the two groups of subjects (high assertion versus high perspective). Specifically, the project will test the hypothesis that the strength of brain connections with the ventromedial prefrontal cortex in comparison with stronger brain connections with the dorsolateral prefrontal cortex.

OBJECTIVE:

Rs-fcMRI will be performed on 12 military subjects previously studied with MPA and who have undergone targeted tests of DMS. The results will be analyzed to determine the strength of connectivity in these subjects with particular focus on the dorsolateral and the ventromedial prefrontal cortices. Correlation analysis will be conducted on the rs-fcMRI findings with respect to the subjects' MPA prediction and actual performance on the DMS task.

This research activity under this statement of work seeks to provide neuroanatomical validation of signature movement patterns and entails the following: The contractor will conduct brain

imaging and neuroscientific aspects associated with APNVCB project, and will supervise the actual brain scans. The contractor will obtain approval from the Institutional Review Board of the Massachusetts General Hospital and Harvard University to ensure compliance with its recommendations; and arrange for and perform the brain imaging scans on each of the 12 study subjects, and analyze and interpret the resulting data.

The contractor shall provide guidance to the project PI about overall neuroscience research and analysis, and how it can be merged with existing political science and behavioral science. The contractor's previous experience and expertise and this statement of work will suggest next steps relative to merging these approaches and how evolving paradigm may support movement analysis integration behaviorally relative to political science and international relations.

The contractor will report on the scientific and real-world viability of future research design testing to further validate the micro foundations of the project, drawing on behavioral neuroscience, political science, international relations and movement analysis methods.

The contractor will participate in project-sponsored movement workshops and will participate in project scientific advisory board meetings.

The contractor supports all aspects of research activity including gaining basic familiarity with the various disciplines of nonverbal communication/behavior involved in the project research in order to support ongoing activity. The Researcher will be required to design, analyze and interpret research efforts in support of project objectives; draft and edit reports, articles, project materials and other deliverables; and interact and coordinate with project participants.

COMPLETION AND SUBMISSION OF REQUIRED DELIVERABLES

Task 1

In collaboration with the project MPA team, the Behavioral Science Neuroscience Researcher will develop the research design and aims for the next stage of the project's validation of movement analysis and decision making investigation. Notably the role of pressure as it pertains to decision intention and decision implementation will be considered. This task will involve brain imaging studies of anatomical structures (diffusion tensor MRI) and functional connectivity (rs-fcMRI). Preliminary plan report provided in electronic format due 30 days after contract award. Final report due 60 days after contract award.

Task 2

In coordination with the project PI, the Behavioral Science Neuroscience Researcher will obtain approval from the Institutional Review Board of the Massachusetts General Hospital ensuring compliance with its recommendations, and make arrangement for and performing the brain imaging scans on each of the 12 study subjects. Copies of final IRB Assurance, drafts of subject permission forms, and other relevant background or questionnaires or action taking that subjects will be asked to complete will be prepared for review by the project PI. Report in electronic format due 45 days after contract award.

Task 3

The Behavioral Science Neuroscience Researcher shall supervise the brain imaging and neuroscientific aspects of the next stage of the project. This includes analyzing and interpreting brain imaging findings and presenting them in statistical sets to support analysis relative to the 2011 MPA pilot study data (movement patterns and experimental decision making findings from the computer scenarios). The implications for predicting decision making style and discussion of other scientifically relevant correlates such as cognitive and emotional measures will be included. This activity will be delivered in a report form to the team including rationale, literature discussion, findings with statistical and data depictions, discussion and project recommendations. Preliminary report in electronic format due 150 days after contract award. Final report due 180 days after contract award.

Task 4

The Behavioral Science Neuroscience Researcher shall draft a report addressing the results of the magnetic resonance imaging and the pilot study and relevance to project goals. Report shall be written in such a style that it can be recrafted in a more specific and focused manner for later submission to appropriate national security and policy organizations. Preliminary report in electronic format due 240 days after contract award. Final report due 300 days after contract award.

Task 5

Consult with and support the multi-disciplinary project team as necessary relative to research design, pilot testing, reporting, and follow-on research efforts.

TRAVEL REQUIREMENTS: The contractor will work primarily in and around Cambridge, MA and at the Naval War College in Newport, RI. No additional compensation will be authorized for travel.
