

**PERFORMANCE WORK STATEMENT
FOR
LOCAL CIVILIAN RANGE USAGE IN SUPPORT OF
COMBAT SKILLS BASIC / SUSTAINMENT UNIT LEVEL TRAINING**

1. BACKGROUND

Amphibious Construction Battalion TWO (PHIBCB TWO) primary missions are Logistics Over-the-Shore (LOTS), Joint LOTS, and Maritime Prepositioned Forces (MPF) operations including ship-to-shore transportation of vehicles, tanks, weapons systems, combat cargo, bulk fuel and water, and tactical camp operations. Secondary missions include assistance to Landing Force Support Party operations and providing construction support.

PHIBCB TWO is rapidly changing to mostly Reserve Component (RC) personnel in FY15. These newly reporting RC personnel are unqualified in mission requirements. PHIBCB TWO is billeted 50 Defensive Unit (DU) Reserve Component (RC) personnel who need to immediately be able to respond to all defensive and tactical mission requirements and train the other unqualified 800+ PHIBCB TWO AC and RC personnel. These 50 DU RC personnel have a limited time on station to become fully mission qualified and 24 DU RC personnel have already coordinated work and family schedules and have fully funded travel orders and committed to coming aboard 30MAY-12JUN15 for their once a year, two week Annual Training requirement.

PHIBCB TWO remains responsible for providing the following ROC-POE required operational capabilities (not all inclusive but rather those ROCs that play into tactical camp operations):

- o Provide qualified personnel to conduct site survey.
- o Provide mobile training team or other training assistance.
- o Conduct local security defense combat operations (plan and train).
- o Maintain security against unfriendly acts.
- o Conduct limited local security defensive combat operations (plan & train).
- o Conduct systems/weapons demonstration for foreign dignitaries.
- o Camp defensive measures, convoy operations, infrastructure protection, reinforcement and repair.
- o Provide Anti-Terrorism assistance and defense.
- o TOA weapons familiarization and live-fire range execution
- o Clear and repair utilities and facilities damaged by natural disaster, fire and civil disturbance; decontaminate CBR effects.
- o Train assigned and embark personnel in first aid, self and buddy aid procedures; train stretcher bearers.
- o Provide administrative and logistics support to augmentation personnel and their associate equipment that are assigned to triage and CBR decontamination stations.
- o Train designated non-medical personnel to assist in triage management care for CBR contamination casualties.

- o Train designated non-medical personnel in CBR casualty decontamination
- o Conduct field detection, identification, and analysis of potential biological warfare agents and/or naturally occurring military relevant public health diseases.
- o Re-embark and transport personnel of the landing force.
- o Re-embark and transport material, equipment and supplies.
- o Plan/direct the re-embarkation and transportation of equipment, material, supplies and personnel.
- o Maintain tactical voice communications.
- o Maintain visual communications (plan and train).
- o Process messages.
- o Maintain internal communication systems.
- o Provide tactical, secure voice or data communications (plan and train).

The core unit of 50 Defensive Unit (DU) RC personnel is essential to quickly become subject matter experts in PHIBCB TWO ROC-POE tactical operational requirements (explained above) to be able to immediately instruct in and provide perimeter security, entry control, convoy security, and security patrol. The course will immediately mission-qualify half of the Defensive Unit where currently none are qualified. These personnel will also act as subject matter experts who will instruct others in defensive and tactical mission requirements. Without this training the DU will remain unqualified, unable to respond to mission requirements or train other personnel for another 18 months.

2. DESCRIPTION

This Performance Work Statement (PWS) establishes the requirements for 24 DU RC personnel to attend a military tactics course of instruction specializing in weapons proficiency, tactical driving, convoy operations and anti-terrorism/force protection measures. The course must be no longer than 12 days to fit within RC annual training time on station. This PWS identifies requirements that meet the Individual Training Plans (ITPs) of Defensive Unit personnel to become fully mission qualified and immediately able to provide perimeter security, entry control, convoy security, and security patrol, as well as becoming the DU subject matter experts for 800+ PHIBCB TWO AC and RC personnel.

PHIBCB TWO RC personnel report to Joint Expeditionary Base Little Creek (JEBLC) Virginia Beach, VA, where they receive berthing and messing so all training ranges and instruction must be located within 50 miles of Virginia Beach, VA, as daily travel will be required. This PWS addresses the training range and instructor requirements. The vendor shall provide training ranges, instructors, and medical support. The contractor shall be required to work closely with designated PHIBCB TWO Training Department in the scheduling of training ranges and instruction defined herein.

2.1 TRAINING RANGES AND INSTRUCTION

The proposed training ranges and instruction need to support the following skill sets:

a. Conduct Tactical Driving Emergency Response – classroom and practical exercise – ABS and NON-ABS.

- Straight Line Braking Drills
- Turning and Braking Drills
- Braking and Turning Drills
- Slalom
- Multiple Avoidance Driving Drills
- Instinctive Response Drills (with surprise)
- Skid Control on Skid Pad
- Off Road Recovery
- City and Urban Congested Traffic Driving (Sedans)
- Unknown or uncertain “Rules of the Road”
- Driving in close proximity and constant movement
- Driving Beyond Normal Limits Classroom and Practical Exercise
- High speed driving techniques
- Minimum visual distance considerations
- Intersections and Stop Signs
- Whole Road Concepts
- Restricted Lane Concepts
- Cornering Techniques
- Braking Zones
- Setting up for the corner
- Turning and Braking entering the corner
- Getting the vehicle pointed and balanced
- Exiting the corner under control

b. Conduct Evasive Actions Briefing and Practical Exercise.

- Ramming through Barricades
- Reversing out
- Y Turns – Reverse 180 turn
- P I T
- Driver down - Right Front Seat Driving Drills
- Countering the Drive - By Threat

c. Conduct Convoy classroom-practical exercise

- Attack Recognition Seminar
- Convoy Mock Attack and Evasive response
- Convoy Mock Attack and Evasive Action Scenarios

d. Conduct Off-road –classroom and practical exercise

- Off road brief and practical exercises
- Obstacles
- Towing procedures
- Trail rides

e. Combat Terrorism. Provide training ranges, instruction, and training equipment that support PHIBCB TWO assets to perform defensive and offensive measures to reduce vulnerability of individuals and property to terrorist acts; to prevent, deter, and respond to terrorism.

- Provide Firearms Instructors
- Provide Role Players
- Provide Urban Training Area (MOUT)
- Pistol/Rifle Flat Range – Multi-Purpose (Automated)
- Pistol/Rifle Flat Range – Unknown Distance
- Target/Shoot Vehicle (non-drivable)
- Primary Training Vehicles
- Sport Utility Vehicles (Suburbans)
- Off-Road Vehicles
- Provide Paintball Equipment

2.2 AGENCY TO PROVIDE TRAINING SUPPORT

The vendor will provide and/or coordinate the delivery of all training ranges. PHIBCB TWO POC will be the focal point for coordination of training support and resolution of issues surrounding the training. PHIBCB TWO POC information will be provided upon award of the contract.

3. REQUIREMENTS SUMMARY

a. Provide marksmanship instructors and ranges in support of the following four day combat marksmanship training at distances from 25 yards to 300 yards:

- Pistol/Rifle Flat Range – Unknown Distance
 - 9mm ball
 - 5.56mm ball
- Pistol/Rifle Flat Range – Multi-Purpose (Automated)
 - 9mm ball
 - 5.56mm ball

b. Provide Tactical Driving training, instruction, and equipment for three days of instruction on track and off road.

- Emergency Response – classroom and practical exercise – ABS and NON-ABS.
- Evasive Actions Briefing and Practical Exercise
- Convoy classroom-practical exercise
- Off-road –classroom and practical exercise

c. Provide Urban Training Area training, instruction, and equipment in support of conducting the following day training:

- Vehicle Bailouts
- Immediate action/down vehicle drills
- Urban Training Area (MOUT)
- Role players
- Paintball (Force on Force Training).

4. ADDITIONAL REQUIREMENTS:

Contracted training ranges must also meet and provide the following:

- a. Steel Reactive Targets (SRT) shall meet certified Brinell hardness rating of 400 to 550. Steel with an abrasion resistant coating coupled with meeting the Brinell hardness rating is preferred.
- b. Qualified EMT on site to provide medical coverage during all training evolutions.
- c. Paper targets for all training evolutions/scenarios.
- e. Bullet traps in support of CQC/shoot house training.
- d. Provide paint and brush for SRT maintenance.
- e. Brass pick-up and disposal.
- f. Provide climate controlled classroom.
- g. Provide ammunition/explosive storage area.
- h. Provide covered area with tables for personnel to load ammunition magazines and perform weapons maintenance.
- i. Provide Paintball equipment and ammunition.

4.1 If any of the supplies do not conform to the Government's requirements, the government may require the contractor to provide the supplies again in conformity with contract requirements, at no increase in contract amount. When the defects in services cannot be corrected by re-performance, the Government may:

1. Require the contractor to take necessary action to ensure that future performance conforms to contract requirements; and
2. Reduce the contract price to reflect the reduced value of the services performed.

5. GOVERNMENT-FURNISHED PROPERTY

5.1 PHIBCB TWO will provide all weapons and ammunition for weapons proficiency training. The contractor shall furnish everything else required to perform this PWS as outlined in paragraph 3.0, 4.0 and 4.1 above.

6. GENERAL INFORMATION

6.1 Contract Management: The PHIBCB TWO POC is responsible for technical management of this program. The Procuring Contracting Officer (PCO) is the only person authorized to approve changes under this PWS; and, notwithstanding provisions elsewhere, said authority remains solely with the PCO. In the event the vendor affects any such change at the direction of any person other than the PCO, that change will be considered as unauthorized. The PHIBCB TWO POC will serve as the contracting officer's Point of Contact (POC).

6.2 Emergency Action Plan: The vendor shall comply with the Navy's Emergency Action Plan. This PWS assumes that all personnel are qualified to implement any emergency action plan for the safe conduct of training and classroom evacuation. Onsite medical support must be in compliance with OPNAVINST 3591.1E.

6.3 Mishap: If a mishap involving services under this contract results in an injury, the contractor shall promptly report the incident to the PHIBCB TWO POC, the Contract Manager and PCO. If the Navy conducts an investigation of the accident, the contractor shall cooperate and assist Government personnel until the investigation is complete. Contractors shall include a clause in subcontracts, if any, under this contract to require subcontractor cooperation and assistance in accident investigations. Contractors shall allow authorized Government representatives access to the contractor's facilities, personnel and safety program documentation.

6.4 Contractor Responsibility for Safety: Nothing in the PWS, nor any Government action or failure to act in surveillance of this contract, shall relieve the contractor of its responsibility for the safety of the contractor's personnel and property, the Government's personnel and property, and the general public. Furthermore, nothing in this PWS shall relieve the contractor of its responsibility for complying with applicable Federal, State, and Local laws, ordinances, codes and regulations (including those requiring applicable licenses and permits) in connection with the performance of this contract.

7. RANGE CERTIFICATIONS

7.1 By submission of a quotation, contractor certifies it possesses a detailed list of available training ranges, certifications, licensing, and any other qualifications or requirements for the training ranges. Upon request, a copy of such list, certifications or licensing shall be provided to the PHIBCB TWO POC.

7.2 During the contract period of performance, if the contractor proposes to close, remove, replace or perform maintenance on a training range contractor must provide a suitable substitute training range as requested by the designated PHIBCB TWO range scheduler.

8. PERIOD OF PERFORMANCE

8.1 The contract shall cover the course of instruction for 24 students from 01-10 June 2015.

9. SECURITY

No security classification required for this task.
