

<p>21</p>	<p>Can we assume a one day 'refresher' style course will always follow a longer 3 or 4 day course of the same subject matter, thus combining travel costs? If not, will they be grouped together? Pricing travel for 1 refresher at a time would like likely make a bid very uncompetitive.</p>	<p>No cannot assume a one day refresher style course will ALWAYS follow other course. There may be stand-alone 1 day courses at some installations, requests for offerings, a directly prior to another class, a request for two back to back 1 day refreshers at the same location, or requests for 1 day refresher the week prior or week after. Generally we attempt to schedule a 1 day refresher immediately before or after a 3 to 4 day class but not always.</p>
<p>22</p>	<p>On the pricing sheets in Section B (pg2 onwards), each sheet asks for Unit Price, Max Amount and Net Max Amount. If Max Amount = Max Quantity x Unit Price, what then is Net Max Amount?"</p>	<p>bidder should only be submitted Unit Price for each CLIN, and Max Amount = Max Quantity x Unit Price. Bidder does not need to enter information for MAX or NET AMT, these are reserved for use by the government in Delivery Order issue to track total \$ requested by government during a contract year. If this is confusing, Max and NET AMT can be removed from each CLIN in the solicitation leaving only Unit Price and Max Amount highlighted for the bidder to provide response.</p>

<p>23</p>	<p>Can we see the agenda for the Navy-provided training courses? We don't yet have Common Access Cards (and experience tells me we can't get one without a contract in place), but some of our subcontractors wish to see the format of the courses. Should I direct this question to Dan Jordan? Is there a way of just seeing agenda, not full course materials?</p>	<p>please refer to Section C of the solicitation, part 2.1.3. Method to obtain is clearly stated for contractors with no CAC.</p>
<p>24</p>	<p>Is the Course Testing Plan something the instructor needs to be involved with, or do they just familiarize themselves with it and run it at the end of class?</p>	<p>Course testing plan is Navy owned and maintained document developed in accordance with NAVEDTRA 132 Navy School Testing Program Management Manual referenced in Section C Appendix A. Plan dictates method of testing, acceptable passing level, unacceptable level remediation requirements, and if physical hardcopy test required, the plan contains master copy of test and answers. Contracted instructor would ensure they have most up to date version of testing plan prior to course delivery, familiarize themselves with document, and ensure testing is being performed in accordance with plan and Navy instructions.</p>

Per solicitation section C 2.1.6 "Contractor will be responsible for ... providing equipment to ensure that the course is effectively presented to the students...". This includes any equipment required to complete tasks under CLIN C.20.3. This is contracts plan to monitor and maintain equipment that the contractor provides.
