RFIS 156-185 RESPONSES

Q156: REFERENCE: Attachment J-1503010-02

QUESTION: In Amendment 5, question 22, the Government says that window cleaning frequencies can be found in the attachment J-1503010-02. This attachment is in the RFP. But it only defines what the service levels are. It does not tell us what service level the windows will be cleaned for this contract.

A156: Refer to Section J-1503010-03 – Janitorial Inventories for Building 27130 and DSS Annex Levels 00 – 03 and see Column “TYPE OF SERVICE CLASS” each area will have the Class of Service A, B, C and D then refer back to Attachment J-1503010 -02 – Service Classes then see Spec Item 3.1.1.5 – Interior Window Cleaning and Spec Item 3.1.1.6 – Exterior Window Cleaning and once you see the Service Class for the area that you will be performing your services you will see the frequencies for each of the service levels.

Q157: For the submitting process to solicitation N40080-13-R-2090 at Quantico; are we allowed to also hand delivers our proposal by the due date or must it be FedEx?

A157: See Section L.L4.b. Proposals shall be sent via FedEx. No hand-delivered proposals are allowed.

Q158: Reference PWS Oil/Water Separator Services and Refuse Collection and Disposal Services. Is backfill required? If so is compaction testing required? For the hazardous soil what is the contaminant? Disposal technologies vary greatly depending on the contaminant and consequently disposal costs vary greatly as well.

A158: Refer to Section 1800000 – Environmental – Spec Item 4.1 – Oil/Water Separator Maintenance – Performance Objective in regards Hazardous and non-hazardous and contaminated soil at Building 27130/MDIA/Russell Knox, Marine Corps Base, Quantico, Virginia. In reference to Refuse Collection and Disposal Services – Refer to Section 1503030 – C – 2.1.6 –Hazardous Waste along with 2.1.12 – Sludge.

Q159: I'd like to bring something to your attention regarding the proposal for RKB. Buried way up in Section F – Deliverables it says that Planned Pesticide Use Sheets are to be submitted with the proposal. Are you all sure you want this with our proposal? It could end up being hundreds of pages long and would automatically throw our proposal over the page limit. Also, this item is typically something that is provided to the KO and COR after award, not with a proposal. Please advise contractors on what to do.

A159: Section F is hereby amended to read that Planned Pesticide Use Sheets are due within 15 days of contract award for review and approval. Any proposed changes in pesticide usage shall be submitted for KO approval at least 5 business days in advance of Pesticide use.

Q160: The data in attachment 0200000 (Fire Extinguisher inventory) does not provide the counts just some charts with green/yellow boxes. Could not find any attachment that had the sprinkler systems (wet, dry, pre-action systems)? We are unable to participate until further data is provided. I do know there are Fire/Sprinkler inspection reports with all the counts, question is they available?

A160: See revised Section J - 1502000 - Facility Investment - Section J-1502000-15 Fire Extinguishers Inventory - Including Annex and Parking Garage.

Q161: 1503050 – Grounds Maintenance, Section 3.1 states “Improved grounds are identified in J-1503050-03, Site Maps.” We cannot read the map provided in J-1503050-03. Can you please provide offerors with an improved map where we can read the text?

A161: Currently there is not another map; however it can be enlarged when it is opened on the computer that will help seeing it more in depth.

Q162: 1503050 – Grounds Maintenance, Section 3.1 states “All clippings, excluding grass clippings, and Trimmings shall be removed in a timely manner to promote a neat and healthy appearance”. Is there a site dump or compost heap on site? If not, where is the closest site dump or compost heap?

A162: Spec Item 3.1 Improved Grounds and Spec Item 3.1.3 Debris Removal, there is no area on base. The Contractor is required to remove debris in a timely manner.

Q163: 1503050 – Grounds Maintenance, Section 3.1.1.2, Edging, states “Edge where grass meets any concrete or asphalt surface, where grass abuts planter beds, or wherever needed to maintain grass delineation”. How many square feet of grass meets concrete?

A163: Refer to Section 1503050 – Grounds Maintenance Spec Item 3.1.1.2 – Edging – On Performance and related information along with Section J -1503050-02 – Table of Contents – Documents, Exhibits and Other Attachments – Grounds Maintenance Inventory – MDIA Edging Linear Feet under Improved Grounds which is 32,147 lf should help with your question along with the site visit if you attended and saw the locations.

Q164: How many square feet of grass meets asphalt?

A164: Please refer to A163 for assistance and look under the inventory for Turf Sq. Ft.

Q165: How many square feet of grass abut planter beds?

A165: Please refer to A163 and 164 for Reference.

Q166: 1503050 – Grounds Maintenance, Section 3.1.4, Shrub & Hedge Maintenance, states “The Contractor shall trim shrubs and hedges to maintain intended Natural plant shape and size appearance and to prevent interference with pedestrians, vehicular traffic, and Building encroachment. How many shrubs and hedges are on site? The attachment J-1503050-03 does not show any.

A166: Refer to Section J-1503050-02 Grounds Maintenance Inventory under Shrub/Plant Maintenance and Tree Maintenance where it shows what is included.

Q167: Reference 1503010 – Janitorial Services. How many restrooms are located on site? The map only has one restroom included.

A167: Refer to Section J-1503010-Janitorial –Attachment J-1503010-03-MDIA B-27130 Levels 00-03 Inventory along with Section J-1503010-03-Janitorial Inventory-MDIA Building –DSS/Annex Inventory which shows Levels/Floors, Room Numbers, Square Feet, Frequency, flooring, type of service (Matrix), and defines what the space is like, restrooms, office, etc.

Q168: How many toilets in men’s’ restrooms are located on site?

A168: Refer to Section J – 1503010 – Janitorial J-1503010-03 Inventories.

Q169: How many urinals in men’s’ restrooms are located on site?

A169: Refer to Section J – 1503010 – Janitorial J-1503010-03 Inventories

Q170: How many toilets in women's restrooms are located on site?

A170: Refer to Section J – 1503010 – Janitorial J-1503010-03 Inventories

Q171: How many sinks in men's restrooms are located on site?

A171: Refer to Section J – 1503010 – Janitorial J-1503010-03 Inventories

Q172: How many sinks in women's restrooms are located on site?

A172: Refer to Section J – 1503010 – Janitorial J-1503010-03 Inventories

Q173: How many water fountains are located on site?

A173: Refer to Section 1503010 – Section C – Janitorial – Spec Item 3.1.1.3 Special Cleaning along with Section J – 1503010-03 – Janitorial Inventories showing fountains, sinks, kitchens, and Coffee messes. Inventories are by square footage not by each fountain, sinks, etc.

Q174: Reference 1503010 – Janitorial Services, Section 3.1.1.1 Emptying Waste Containers.

How many waste containers are located on site?

A174: Refer to Section C – 1503010 – Spec Item – 3.1.1.1– Emptying Waste Containers along with Section 1503010-03 – Janitorial Inventories –Which will show the possibility of where trash cans might be located. There isn't an inventory showing the individual cans by number only areas that Janitorial service is required and that covers doing 3.1.1.1.

Q175: Reference 1503010 – Janitorial Services, Section 3.1.1.5 Interior Window Cleaning.

How many windows are located on site?

A175: Refer to Section J – 1502000-13 – Facility Investment -Windows Inventory. The inventory gives you the following – Room number, Space Description, Number of Windows, Window Type and Dimensions.

Q176: Reference 1503010 – Janitorial Services, Section 3.1.1.6 Exterior Window Cleaning.

How many windows are located on site?

A176: Refer to Section J – 1502000-13 – Facility Investment -Windows Inventory. The inventory gives you the following – Room number, Space Description, Number of Windows, Window Type and Dimensions

Q177: Reference 1503010 – Janitorial Services, Section 3.1.1.8 Window Blinds Cleaning.

Does every window have blinds?

A177: Yes there are blinds every window however, there is no individual inventory for the blinds.

Q178: Reference 1503010 – Janitorial Services, Section 3.1.2.3 Cleaning Walk-off Mats.

How many walk-off mats are located on site?

A178: There isn't an inventory for walk off mats. The Contractor shall service the mats and the surface below the mats to ensure clean where ever you find mats while cleaning the floor surfaces. It's approximately 12 walk off mats, however as stated above there is no inventory and the count can change for some reason or another.

Q179: Reference 1503010 – Janitorial Services, Section 3.1.4.2 states: "The Contractor shall empty waste containers, excluding dumpsters, located in the perimeter area as shown in J-1503010-01 along with J1503010-03 and including Parking Garage areas near Elevators on each level they are located".

It is unclear how many waste containers are located in the perimeter including Parking Garage areas near Elevators using the attachments referenced above. How many waste containers are located in the perimeter including Parking Garage areas near Elevators?

A179: No inventory available for number amount of the Waste Containers around Perimeter at this time unless you were at the site visit and saw their locations or Refer to Section J-1503010-03 – Janitorial Inventory-DSS/Annex/Parking Garage – all levels emptying Perimeter Waste containers around Annex and Parking Garage – Bi -Weekly

Q180: Reference 1503010 – Janitorial Services, Section 3.1.3.3 states: “Work for the restroom/locker room @ Fitness Center is to be completed twice (2x’s) daily per Contractor’s schedule. As shown in J1503010-02 and in J1503010-03”.

It is unclear the Contractor’s schedule based off the provided maps. It appears the provided maps do not contain sufficient information. Will the Government please provide us with new maps that accurately reflect the site?

A180: Refer to Section J-1503010 – Janitorial Services – Attachment J-1503010-02 – Service Classes. Go to Spec Item 3.1.3 Restroom Services - 3.1.3.3 - MDIA Fitness Center Locker Room/Restroom - Service Class A – 2 x’s D which on the bottom page - Key – 2x Daily – Two times per day – MDIA – Fitness Center – Locker Rooms/Restrooms only.

Q181: ELIN X001AC has no quantities so, are bidders to leave this ELIN blank or do you want a price per square foot for Service Class C cleaning?

A181: Refer to Q95-Q100. The Contractor does not have square footage under Janitorial Class C or E, however we reserved the line item a price is not required.

Q182: ELIN X001AE has no quantities nor is there a Service Class E in the Attachment J-1503010-02 Service Class Chart. Are bidders to leave this ELIN blank? If not, please inform bidders what goes into this ELIN.

A182: Yes, Bidders are to leave ELIN Service Class E Restrooms blank customer wants their Restrooms Class A. Refer to Section J-1503010-Janitorial – Attachment J-1503010-03 Inventory – MDIA Building 27130 and Section J-1503010-03 –Janitorial Inventory – MDIA – DSS Annex.

Q183: ELIN X001AG has no frequency nor does the Service Class chart Attachment J-1503010-02 reference any frequencies for restrooms under Service Class B. Are bidders to leave this ELIN blank? If not, please inform bidders what is to be included in the ELIN.

A183: Yes, Bidders are to leave ELIN Blank for Service Class B – Restrooms you can refer to Q182: along with the Inventories Section J-1503010-03 – MDIA and DSS Annex Janitorial Inventory.

Q184: ELIN X001AH is for Service Class E restroom cleaning. However, the Service Class chart Attachment J-1503010-02 does not have a Service Class E for restrooms. The unit of issue for this ELIN is for a man-hour. Are bidders to leave this ELIN blank or are we to place an hourly rate for cleaning a restroom.

A184: Yes, refer to Q182 and Q183 - bidders are to leave ELIN blank however we reserved the line item.

Q185: The header for the ELIN schedules indicates in the unit price cell that the Government wants a Unit Price per Square Foot (yearly). That can be done when the quantity is provided per square foot. However, ELINS AK through AT are not priced by the square foot. They are either by the month and/or per each. Do you want a price per square foot (as indicated in the ELIN price sheet header) for ELINS AK through AT or do you want a price per the quantity and unit of issue. If a price per square foot is required, what should bidders use as the square foot divider?

A185: Refer to Section J-1503010 – 03 -Janitorial Inventories for MDIA/Building 27130 and DSS Annex the cleaning will be by square foot. ELINS AK – Section 1503020 - Pest Control, AL – Section 1503030 – Refuse Control, AM – Section - 1503050 – Grounds Service, AN – Section 1503060 – Street Sweeping and Snow Removal, etc along being Firm Fixed it is a Monthly Cost based on total amount of frequencies per month but with Janitorial it is Square Feet then we can take the footage times the cost per foot.

UPDATED RFIS 65, 73, 74, ETC.

Q65: Can information on warranties of equipment be provided?

A65: Yes, refer to Section C – 1502000-Spec Item 3-FFP Work – The Contractor shall maintain all current Facility Maintenance data and warranty records in the Technical Library and CMMS (Computerized Maintenance Management System) NAVFAC Maximo for Facility Asset Data Management. Refer also to Section C – 0200000 – Management and Administration – Spec Item 2.12 – Technical Library – Existing technical library contents, including facility drawings, operation and maintenance manuals, warranties, Government publications, record drawings and other appropriate material, will be furnished by the Government either by inventories and other documents in the Specification or by the Contractor continually update the library material to ensure materials are returned and data integrity is not compromised.

Q73: Will service request frequency be provided for both MEP and Janitorial?

A73: Yes, for Janitorial – refer to Section 1503010 – Janitorial Section F-Deliverables and J-1503010 – 03 – MDIA Janitorial Inventory – Levels 00-03 including DSS Annex along with Section J-1503010-02 – Service Class. For MEP (Mechanical, Electric and Plumbing) refer to Section J-1502000 – Section F – Deliverables – Spec Item 3 – 3.4 –Schedules. For Facility Investment – refer to Section J- 1502000 -08 – 15 for various inventories for Facility Investment.

Q74: Will the equipment list be provided?

A74: Yes, for MEP (Mechanical, Electric and Plumbing) refer to Section J-1502000 – Section F – Deliverables – Spec Item 3 – 3.4 –Schedules. For Facility Investment – refer to Section J- 1502000 -08 – 15 for various inventories for Facility Investment.

Q88: Reference J-1503050-02, Tree Maintenance, Inventory. We have counted 672 trees...Inventory states 516. Please verify quantity.

A88: Refer to updated Section C 1503050 – Ground Maintenance Spec Item 3.1.6 –Tree Maintenance is NOT APPLICABLE. Table of Contents, Section J – 1503050-01 Service levels, and Section F – Deliveries or Performance have been revised.

Q97: Reference J-0200000-13. Please confirm that the offeror is to price ELINs X001AA through X001AF by SF. Typically, recurring work is priced on a monthly basis. If offeror is to price by SF, is it the Governments intent to only pay by SF cleaned?

A97: to be priced by SF – Note – This was answered through Q95–Q100 and again on Q181-Q185 in more detail.

Q102: Do the Roof Top Units (RTU's) have factory filters installed? If not, what are installed and is there a proprietary vendor associated with purchasing filters?

A102: Refer to Section 1502000 –14 – Master Inventory which list MS-RTU's with all the information for the equipment.

Q122: Is the Visitor Center, Guard Shack and ADN part of this RFP? If so, please provide the inventories for these buildings?

A122: Yes, they are included. Refer to Section 1502000 – All Facility Investment Inventories from J-1502000-14 Master Inventory , J-1502000-5 – PVs & UPVs, J-1502000-06 HVAC, J-1502000-07 Plumbing, J-1502000-08 Gen Systems, J-1502000-09 UPS, J-1502000-10- Bkflw Prev, J-1502000-12-Electrical, J-1502000-13 Bldg. Maintenance and other inventories for fire alarms, lighting. Section J-1503010 – Janitorial Inventories.

Q129: Is the service call count correct for 2014? The RFP states that during all of 2014 there were only 60 service calls?
