Responses to RFIs

1. The project references requested is in the range of 2 – 15 million dollars. Is this amount at the time of award of the project or Projects with final contract amount in this range can be submitted.

Response: Projects submitted shall range in value at time of award between \$2m and \$15m.

2. Please confirm, for Technical Factor 1 – Construction Experience (i) Exterior Building Renovation, it is acceptable to use projects which scopes entailed exterior facility repairs, redevelopment, and/or renovations i.e. site civil, over waterways, utilities, infrastructure etc.? This approach has been acceptable for prior NAVFAC Technical Proposals.

Response: Projects whose scope includes site work are acceptable, however portion of the work must be directly related to exterior building renovation. For example, this could include canopies, exterior lighting, window replacement, etc. The work shall be multi-discipline related to building construction. Projects submitted with scopes described solely as site work will not be accepted.

3. Please clarify if the mandatory Attachment C Construction Experience Form counts toward the thirty (30) double-sided or sixty (60) single-sided maximum page limitation count?

Response: Yes, the Construction Experience Form counts toward the page limitation.

4. In conjunction with the above RFI, if the forms do count towards the limitation requirement count, would NAVFAC consider increasing the maximum page count?

Response: The page limit remains unchanged at this time.

5. Please clarify if the Attachment E Past Performance Questionnaire Form or a completed CPARS Evaluation Form count toward the thirty (30) double-sided or sixty (60) single-sided maximum page limitation count? Considering the Offerors are required to submit a total of six (6) projects, this would account for approximately twenty four (24) pages of the total limited page requirement allowed.

Response: The cover, title page, table of contents, tab dividers, and tab headers are excluded from the page limit.

10. Please clarify if separation sheets used within a technical proposal counts towards the thirty (30) double-sided or sixty (60) single-sided maximum page limitation count?

Response: See response to RFI # 9.

11. Solicitation page 11 of 117, Volume 2: Price Proposal states Offeror shall submit one copy whereas page 23 of 117 states 2 copies of the Price Proposal (1 Original 1 Copy). Please clarify which is correct?

Response: Page 11 is correct. Please submit one copy of the Price Proposal. Page 23 is applicable for future task orders under the MACC contracts. However, the exact quantity/copies will be specified in each task order's RFP requirements.

12. Please confirm it is acceptable to submit a Price Proposal CD-ROM, with the SEED Project's Price Schedule, without the Total price included/entered?

Response: Yes, as long as the completed Price Schedule is submitted as instructed in according with the RFP.

13. Please advise if non-Joint Ventures and/or non-SBA approved mentor/protégé teaming arrangements will be considered?

Response: See evaluation criteria.

15. Experience as the Prime Contractor on all of the submitted projects. Can an Offerors relevant Construction Experience and associated CPARS for a project that was completed under a Joint Venture where the Offeror was the majority Joint Venture stakeholder with over 51% of the SBA Certified Mentor Protégé Joint Venture agreement be used as relevant Construction Experience for this solicitation?

18. Page 14 of 117 / Factor 2, Safety: paragraph (1) states EMR requested for the three previous completed calendar years (2013, 2014, and 2015). Question: the information in the solicitation conflicts with Attachment D, which calls for “2 previous completed calendar years. Which one is correct?

The classifications are listed in alphabetical order of "identifiers" that indicate whether the particular rate is a union rate (current union negotiated rate for local), a survey rate (weighted average rate) or a union average rate (weighted union average rate).

Union Rate Identifiers

A four letter classification abbreviation identifier enclosed in dotted lines beginning with characters other than "SU" or "UAVG" denotes that the union classification and rate were prevailing for that classification in the survey.

Example:

PLUM0198-005 07/01/2014. PLUM is an abbreviation identifier of the union which prevailed in the survey for this classification, which in this example would be Plumbers. 0198 indicates the local union number or district council number where applicable, i.e., Plumbers Local 0198. The next number, 005 in the example, is an internal number used in processing the wage determination. 07/01/2014 is the effective date of the most current negotiated rate, which in this example is July 1, 2014.

Union prevailing wage rates are updated to reflect all rate changes in the collective bargaining agreement (CBA) governing this classification and rate.

Survey Rate Identifiers

Classifications listed under the "SU" identifier indicate that no one rate prevailed for this classification in the survey and the published rate is derived by computing a weighted average rate based on all the rates reported in the survey for that classification. As this weighted average rate includes all rates reported in the survey, it may include both union and non-union rates. Example: SULA2012-007 5/13/2014. SU indicates the rates are survey rates based on a weighted average calculation of rates and are not majority rates. LA indicates the State of Louisiana. 2012 is the year of survey on which these classifications and rates are based. The next number, 007 in the example, is an internal number used in producing the wage determination. 5/13/2014 indicates the survey completion date for the classifications and rates under that identifier.

Survey wage rates are not updated and remain in effect until a new survey is conducted.

Union Average Rate Identifiers

Classification(s) listed under the UAVG identifier indicate that no single majority rate prevailed for those classifications; however, 100% of the data reported for the classifications was union data. EXAMPLE: UAVG-OH-0010 08/29/2014. UAVG indicates that the rate is a weighted union average rate. OH indicates the state. The next number, 0010 in the example, is an internal number used in producing the wage determination. 08/29/2014 indicates the survey completion date for the classifications and rates under that identifier.

A UAVG rate will be updated once a year, usually in January of each year, to reflect a weighted average of the current negotiated/CBA rate of the union locals from which the rate is based.

WAGE DETERMINATION APPEALS PROCESS

If this contract is covered by the EO, the contractor must pay all workers in any classification listed on this wage determination at least \$10.15 (or the applicable wage rate listed on this wage determination, if it is higher) for all hours spent performing on the contract in calendar year 2016. The EO minimum wage rate will be adjusted annually. Additional information on contractor requirements and worker protections under the EO is available at www.dol.gov/whd/govcontracts.

Unlisted classifications needed for work not included within the scope of the classifications listed may be added after award only as provided in the labor standards contract clauses (29CFR 5.5 (a) (1) (ii)).

The body of each wage determination lists the classification and wage rates that have been found to be prevailing for the cited type(s) of construction in the area covered by the wage determination. The classifications are listed in alphabetical order of "identifiers" that indicate whether the particular rate is a union rate (current union negotiated rate for local), a survey rate (weighted average rate) or a union average rate (weighted union average rate).

Union Rate Identifiers

A four letter classification abbreviation identifier enclosed in dotted lines beginning with characters other than "SU" or "UAVG" denotes that the union classification and rate were prevailing for that classification in the survey. Example: PLUM0198-005 07/01/2014. PLUM is an abbreviation identifier of the union which prevailed in the survey for this classification, which in this example would be Plumbers. 0198 indicates the local union number or district council number where applicable, i.e., Plumbers Local 0198. The next number, 005 in the example, is an internal number used in processing the wage determination. 07/01/2014 is the effective date of the most current negotiated rate, which in this example is July 1, 2014.

Union prevailing wage rates are updated to reflect all rate changes in the collective bargaining agreement (CBA) governing this classification and rate.

Survey Rate Identifiers

Classifications listed under the "SU" identifier indicate that no one rate prevailed for this classification in the survey and the published rate is derived by computing a weighted average rate based on all the rates reported in the survey for that classification. As this weighted average rate includes all rates reported in the survey, it may include both union and non-union rates. Example: SULA2012-007 5/13/2014. SU indicates the rates are survey rates based on a weighted average calculation of rates and are not majority rates. LA indicates the State of Louisiana. 2012 is the year of survey on which these classifications and rates are based. The next number, 007 in the example, is an internal number used in producing the wage determination. 5/13/2014 indicates the survey completion date for the classifications and rates under that identifier.

Survey wage rates are not updated and remain in effect until a new survey is conducted.

Union Average Rate Identifiers

Classification(s) listed under the UAVG identifier indicate that no single majority rate prevailed for those classifications; however, 100% of the data reported for the classifications was union data. EXAMPLE: UAVG-OH-0010 08/29/2014. UAVG indicates that the rate is a weighted union average rate. OH indicates the state. The next number, 0010 in the example, is an internal number used in producing the wage determination. 08/29/2014 indicates the survey completion date for the classifications and rates under that identifier.

A UAVG rate will be updated once a year, usually in January of each year, to reflect a weighted average of the current negotiated/CBA rate of the union locals from which the rate is based.

WAGE DETERMINATION APPEALS PROCESS

1.) Has there been an initial decision in the matter? This can be:

- * an existing published wage determination
- * a survey underlying a wage determination
- * a Wage and Hour Division letter setting forth a position on a wage determination matter
- * a conformance (additional classification and rate) ruling

On survey related matters, initial contact, including requests for summaries of surveys, should be with the Wage and Hour Regional Office for the area in which the survey was conducted because those Regional Offices have responsibility for the Davis-Bacon survey program. If the response from this initial

contact is not satisfactory, then the process described in 2.) and 3.) should be followed.

With regard to any other matter not yet ripe for the formal process described here, initial contact should be with the Branch of Construction Wage Determinations. Write to:

2.) If the answer to the question in 1.) is yes, then an interested party (those affected by the action) can request review and reconsideration from the Wage and Hour Administrator (See 29 CFR Part 1.8 and 29 CFR Part 7). Write to:

The request should be accompanied by a full statement of the interested party's position and by any information (wage payment data, project description, area practice material, etc.) that the requestor considers relevant to the issue.

3.) If the decision of the Administrator is not favorable, an interested party may appeal directly to the Administrative Review Board (formerly the Wage Appeals Board). Write to:

4.) All decisions by the Administrative Review Board are final.
