1.3	Acquisition of Additional Work	The Government reserves the right to acquire additional services at additional locations within a 150 kilometers radius from Gaeta and Capodichino Base in addition to the services and locations identified in the recurring work requirements of this contract. Additional services will be incorporated into the contract in accordance with the CHANGES clause, SECTION I or ordered under the indefinite delivery indefinite quantity provisions of the contract. Items of work not covered by this contract but within the general intent are considered in the scope of this contract.
1.4	Background Information	<p>U.S. Naval Support Activity Naples, Italy is a host to more than 50 separate commands and approximately 8,500 personnel. NSA Naples is located approximately 60 miles (96 kilometers) south from the city of Gaeta and 145 miles (235 kilometers) from Rome.</p> <p>The Gaeta Port area is an installation under the cognizance of the Italian Navy and is shared among the U.S. Navy, Italian Navy, and NATO Forces. When required (e.g. facility alteration/ modification and/or new installations), the U.S. Government will request approval from Italian authorities. The Contractor shall ensure that the Fleet Landing facilities are not altered/modified while performing duties under this contract, until the above mentioned permit/approval has been obtained. Specific issues may be addressed on a case-by-case basis.</p>
1.5	Verification of Workload and Conditions	Throughout the PWS, the workload data is generally referred to as being located in Section J. Section J provides data such as inventories, maps, floor plans, and tables to represent the type, quantity and location of services to be provided. However, offerors are encouraged to visit the project site during the site visit for offerors and to visit the technical library during posted hours as part of its due diligence to assess the nature of work and conditions under which work is to be performed.
1.6	Climate Patterns	<p>The Naples, Campania region has a hot Mediterranean/ dry-summer subtropical climate that is mild with moderate seasonality. Summers are dry and hot due to the domination of subtropical high pressure systems while winters experience moderate temperatures and changeable, rainy weather due to the polar front.</p> <p>In the winter time temperatures by day reach 13.1°C (55.6°F) on average falling to 4.4°C (39.9°F) overnight. In spring time temperatures climb reaching 18.7°C (65.6°F) generally in the afternoon with overnight lows of 8.8°C (47.8°F). During summer average high temperatures are 28.3°C (83°F) and average low temperatures are 17.2°C (62.9°F). Come autumn/fall temperatures decrease achieving average highs of 21.7°C (71.1°F) during the day and lows of 11.5°C (52.8°F) generally shortly after sunrise.</p> <p>Total annual Precipitation averages 1006.6 mm (39.6 inches) which is equivalent to 1006.6 Liters/m² (24.69 Gallons/ft²).</p> <p>Refer to weather information websites such as “National Oceanic and Atmospheric Administration (NOAA)” at http://weather.noaa.gov/weather/IT_cc.html and “National Weather Service” at www.weather.gov for more details on Italy climate patterns.</p>
