EVALUATION FACTORS

PART I – GENERAL

1.1 CONTRACT SCOPE

The work includes material, labor, equipment and supervision to perform asphaltic concrete pavement work; portland cement concrete work; including sidewalks and curbs; marking and striping of pavement; signage; **landscaping services**; and incidental related work. The work shall be located at the Navy, Marine Corp, Air Force, and other Federal facilities in the State of Hawaii, approximately as indicated. The exact location will be shown by the Contracting Officer on each individual task order.

1.2 PREFERENCE FOR MAKING MULTIPLE AWARDS

This acquisition is being advertised as a competitive, unrestricted procurement. This source selection procurement requires both technical and price proposals. This procurement consists of one solicitation with the intent to award one IDIQ contract.

1.3 MAGNITUDE OF THE ACQUISITION

The total dollar value of this acquisition is \$95,000,000 over the life of the contract or 60 months, whichever occurs first. The minimum guarantee for the base period only will be \$10,000. The minimum guarantee may be met by the issuance of a task order during the base period or option period(s). The task order minimum and maximum will be stated as \$2,000 to \$5,000,000, respectively.

1.4 PROPOSAL EVALUATION

The Government intends to award a contract resulting from this solicitation to the responsible offeror with the lowest price technically acceptable proposal based on the evaluation factors in the solicitation.

1.5 ENFORCEABILITY OF THE PROPOSAL

The proposals must set forth full, accurate and complete information as required by this solicitation. The Government will rely on such information in the award of the contracts. By submission of the offer, the Offeror agrees that all items proposed (e.g., key personnel, subcontractors, etc.) will be utilized for the duration of the contract and any substitutions will be equal or better than as proposed and accepted for contract award and shall require prior Contracting Officer's approval.

PART II – EVALUATION CRITERIA

2.1 BASIS OF AWARD

- a. The Government intends to evaluate proposals and award one contract without discussions with offerors (except clarifications as described in FAR 15.306(a)). The Government reserves the right to conduct discussions if the Contracting Officer later determines them to be necessary.
- b. The number of proposals to be evaluated for technical acceptability may be limited to the three lowest priced offers at the discretion of the contracting officer.
- c. An overall non-price factors rating must be at least “ACCEPTABLE” in order to be eligible for award. An “UNACCEPTABLE” rating in any factor results in the overall non-price factors proposal being rated “UNACCEPTABLE” unless corrected through discussions. An overall non-price factors rating of “UNACCEPTABLE” makes a proposal ineligible for award.

2.2 EVALUATION FACTORS

The solicitation requires the evaluation of price and the following technical factors:

Factor 1 – Corporate Experience

Factor 2 – Safety

Factor 3 - Past Performance

The distinction between experience and past performance is experience pertains to the types of work and volume of work completed by a contractor that are comparable to the types of work covered by this requirement, in terms of size, scope, and complexity. Past performance relates to how well a contractor has performed.

a. Non-Cost/Price Evaluation Factors:

1. Factor 1 – Corporate Experience

(a) Solicitation Submittal Requirements:

(1) Submit a maximum of five (5) construction projects in which the Offeror was the Prime Contractor that best demonstrates the Offeror's experience on recent and relevant projects that are similar in size, scope, and complexity to the RFP, using the Offeror's Past Performance/Experience Information (Attachment 1). For purposes of this evaluation, a recent and relevant project is defined as asphaltic concrete pavement work; portland cement concrete work; including sidewalks and curbs; marking and striping of pavement; signage; **landscaping services** and incidental related work, valued at \$300,000 or more, and completed within five (5) years of the date of issuance of this RFP. Contracts listed may include those entered into with Federal, State, or local governmental agencies, as well as contracts with commercial entities.

(2) Attachment 1 is MANDATORY and SHALL be used to submit project information. Except as specifically requested, the Government will not consider information submitted in addition to this form. Do not alter Attachment 1, with the exception of expanding the individual blocks on this form.

(3) If the Offeror is a Joint Venture (JV), relevant project experience should be submitted for projects completed by the Joint Venture entity or the Joint Venture partners. Offerors are still limited to a total of five (5) projects combined.

(4) The Offeror may utilize experience of a subcontractor that will perform major or critical aspects of the requirement to demonstrate construction experience under this evaluation factor. The Offer

must provide a letter of commitment and an explanation of the meaningful involvement that the subcontractor will have in performance of this contract. Offerors are limited to a total of five projects for its subcontractor.

(b) Basis of Evaluation:

(1) The Government will evaluate an offeror's corporate experience on asphaltic concrete pavement work; portland cement concrete work; including sidewalks and curbs; marking and striping of pavement; signage; **landscaping services** and incidental related work. The Government will use Attachment 1 to assess an offeror's qualifications to manage and complete the requirements of the solicitation.

(2) Contracts will be considered relevant if

-it was similar in scope (i.e., asphaltic concrete pavement work; portland cement concrete work; including sidewalks and curbs; marking and striping of pavement; signage; **landscaping services** and incidental related work);

-it was valued at \$300,000 or more per year; **AND**

-it was completed within five (5) years of the date of issuance of this RFP.

2. Factor 2 - Safety

(a) Solicitation Submittal Requirements: The Offeror shall submit the following information: (For a partnership or joint venture, the following submittal requirements are required for each contractor who is part of the partnership or joint venture; however, only one safety narrative is required. EMR and DART Rates shall not be submitted for subcontractors.)

(1) Experience Modification Rate (EMR): For the **three** previous complete calendar years (2012, 2013 and 2014), submit your EMR (which compares your company's annual losses in insurance claims against its policy premiums over a **three** year period). If you have no EMR, affirmatively state so, and explain why. **Any extenuating circumstances that affected the EMR and upward or downward trends should be addressed as part of this element.**

(2) OSHA Days Away from Work, Restricted Duty, or Job Transfer (DART) Rate: For the **three** previous complete calendar years (2012, 2013 and 2014), submit your OSHA Days Away from Work, Restricted Duty, or Job Transfer (DART) Rate, as defined by the U.S. Department of Labor, Occupational Safety and Health Administration. If you cannot submit an OSHA DART Rate, affirmatively state so, and explain why. **Any extenuating circumstances that affected the OSHA DART Rate data and upward or downward trends should be addressed as part of this element.**

(3) Technical Approach for Safety: Describe the plan that the Offeror will implement to evaluate safety performance of potential subcontractors, as a part of the selection process for all levels of subcontractors. Also, describe any innovative methods that the Offeror will employ to ensure and monitor safe work practices at all subcontractor levels. The Safety Narrative shall be limited to two pages.

(b) Basis of Evaluation: The Government is seeking to determine that the Offeror has consistently demonstrated a commitment to safety and that the Offeror plans to properly manage and implement safety procedures for itself and its subcontractors. The Government will evaluate the Offeror's overall safety record, the Offeror's plan to select and monitor subcontractors, any and innovative safety methods that the Offeror plans to implement for this procurement. The Government's sources of information for evaluating safety may include, but are not limited to, OSHA, NAVFAC's Facility Accident and Incident Reporting (FAIR) database, and other related databases. While the Government may elect to consider data from other sources, the burden of providing detailed, current, accurate and complete safety information regarding these submittal requirements rests with the Offeror. The evaluation will collectively consider the following:

- Experience Modification Rate (EMR)
- OSHA Days Away from Work, Restricted Duty, or Job Transfer (DART) Rate
- Offeror Technical Approach to Safety
- Other sources of information available to the Government

(1) Experience Modification Rate (EMR): The Government will evaluate the EMR to determine if the Offeror has demonstrated a history of safe work practices taking into account any upward or downward trends and extenuating circumstances that impact the rating.

(2) OSHA Days Away from Work, Restricted Duty, or Job Transfer (DART) Rate: The Government will evaluate the OSHA DART Rate to determine if the Offeror has demonstrated a history of safe work practices taking into account any upward or downward trends and extenuating circumstances that impact the rates.

(3) Technical Approach to Safety: The Government will evaluate the narrative to determine the degree to which subcontractor safety performance will be considered in the selection of all levels of subcontractors on the upcoming project. The Government will also evaluate the narrative to determine the degree to which innovations are being proposed that may enhance safety on this procurement.

b. Past Performance:

Factor 3 – Past Performance

(a) Solicitation Submittal Requirements:

(1) IF A COMPLETED CPARS EVALUATION IS AVAILABLE, IT SHALL BE SUBMITTED WITH THE PROPOSAL. IF THERE IS NOT A COMPLETED CPARS EVALUATION, the Past Performance Questionnaire (PPQ), Attachment 2, included in the solicitation is provided for the offeror or its team members to submit to the client for each project the offeror includes in its proposal for Factor 1, Corporate Experience. AN OFFEROR SHALL NOT SUBMIT A PPQ WHEN A COMPLETED CPARS IS AVAILABLE.

(2) IF A CPARS EVALUATION IS NOT AVAILABLE, ensure correct phone numbers and email addresses are provided for the client point of contact. Completed PPQs should be submitted with your proposal. If the offeror is unable to obtain a completed PPQ from a client for a project(s) before proposal closing date, the offeror should complete and submit with the proposal the first page of the PPQ, which will provide contract and client information for the respective project(s). Offerors should follow-up with clients/references to ensure timely submittal of questionnaires. If the client requests, questionnaires may be submitted directly to the Government's point of contact, Ms. Shari Lillie, via email at shari.lillie@navy.mil prior to proposal closing date. Offerors shall not incorporate by reference into their proposal PPQs or CPARS previously submitted for other RFPs. However, this does not preclude the Government from utilizing previously submitted PPQ information in the past performance evaluation.

- Also include performance recognition documents received within the last five years, such as awards, award fee determinations, customer letters of commendation, and any other forms of performance recognition.

- In addition to the above, the Government may review any other sources of information for evaluating past performance. Other sources may include, but are not limited to, past performance information retrieved through the Past Performance Information Retrieval System (PPIRS) using all CAGE/DUNS numbers of team members (partnership, joint venture, teaming arrangement, or parent company/subsidiary/affiliate) identified in the offeror's proposal, inquiries of owner representative(s), and any other known sources not provided by the offeror.

- While the Government may elect to consider data from other sources, the burden of providing detailed, current, accurate and complete past performance information rests with the Offeror.

(b) Basis of Evaluation: The degree to which past performance evaluations and all other past performance information reviewed by the Government (e.g., PPIRS, Federal Awardee Performance and Integrity Information System (FAPIS), Electronic Subcontract Reporting System (eSRS), performance recognition documents, and information obtained from any other source) reflect a trend of satisfactory performance considering:

- A pattern of successful completion of tasks;
- A pattern of deliverables that are timely and of good quality;
- A pattern of cooperativeness and teamwork with the Government at all levels (task managers, contracting officers, auditors, etc.);
- Recency of tasks performed that are identical to, similar to, or related to the task at hand; and
- A respect for stewardship of Government funds

c. Price Evaluation:

1. Price.

(a) Solicitation Submittal Requirements. Offerors shall complete the Summary of Coefficients for this solicitation and Attachment 3, Coefficient Evaluation Worksheet.

(b) Basis of Evaluation: The price proposal will be evaluated to determine the reasonableness, realism and completeness of the Offeror's proposal. Analysis will be performed by one or more of the following techniques to ensure a fair and reasonable price:

- (1) Comparison of proposed prices received in response to the RFP.
- (2) Comparison of proposed prices with the Independent Government Estimate.
- (3) Comparison of proposed prices with available historical information.
- (4) Comparison of market survey results.

A price that is found to be either unreasonable high or unrealistically low may be indicative of an inherent lack of understanding of the solicitation requirements and may result in the overall proposal not being considered for award.
